Therapeutic Duplication

All Medication orders are clear and accurate. Unnecessary therapeutic duplication of medications orders is not acceptable; the Pharmacist must stop the line, call, and clarify with the practitioner what the correct criteria are for the order.

PAIN MEDS: If IV and PO route of administration is ordered for the same pain scale or indication for use, the PO route will be given unless the patient has nausea and/or vomiting or is unable to tolerate oral route.

NAUSEA/VOMITING MEDS: If multiple orders exist for as needed nausea and/or vomiting, the hierarchy of order of administration will be (unless otherwise indicated in the order comments):

- 1. Ondansetron (Zofran)
- 2. Metoclopramide (Reglan)
- 3. Prochlorperazine (Compazine)
- 4. Promethazine (Phenergan) Oral/Rectal Only
- 5. Trimethobenzamide (Tigan)

CONSTIPATION MEDS: If multiple orders exist for as needed constipation, the hierarchy of order of administration will be (unless otherwise indicated in the order comments):

- 1. Docusate (Colace) oral
- 2. Senna oral
- 3. Docusate/Senna (Senokot S) oral
- 4. Bisacodyl (Dulcolax) oral
- 5. Magnesium Citrate oral
- 6. Polyethylene Glycol oral
- 7. Magnesium Hydroxide (Milk of Magnesia) oral
- 8. Bisacodyl (Dulcolax) suppository

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
